I would also like to thank and acknowledge the efforts of Bill Doring who was our junior school teacher. Bill will be commencing work in 2021 at Portland Primary School. Thank you also to Tammy Woodgate our school cleaner who is finishing up with us at the end of the year. Your attention to detail and cleanliness was very much appreciated.

2020 ACHIEVEMENTS

Curriculum - Introduction of MAPPEN, LOTE (Italian), Literacy Planet, CAFÉ and Music. Non-negotiable timetable implemented for Literacy and Numeracy learning. Employment of a full time graduate teacher. We also received new literacy books. We all learnt how to use Webex and the students participated in quite a few incursions using Webex such as the Chinese Cultural activities and RACV Safety Squad and the school participated in a Hands up to Change the Story project. Our school values were also updated to reflect our school today. They are Show Respect, Show empathy , Be Kind and Be a Mate. The introduction of School Wide Positive Behaviour was also implemented in Term 4. we also participated in the High Ability Leadership course too.

Uniform and logo - the school updated their uniforms and logo and all of the children began to wear their new school tops and windcheaters.

Furniture - The library was moved to the portable building and we received new shelving and seats and tables to replace the old furniture in the library. We also got new tables and seats to sit on for when we eat our play lunch and lunch. This furniture was from a grant from GIVIT. In the staffroom and principal's office, the chairs were replaced with new furniture. We also received new television screens in each classroom and this was also from a grant Ms Edward's put in for. In Term 4 new computer and headphones were also delivered to the school through a grant and we also received a new ride on mower which was also received from a grant.

Activities—During Term 4 the junior school had a sleep over and the senior school did a white water rafting day on the Snowy River. We also had channel 10 turn up to the school and take photographs and film us when the Melbourne Cup visited our school. Early in Term 4 the whole school excursion spent a day at Karoonda Park and we did abseiling, flying fox and paddling in the kayaks. We also had our whole school excursion to Lakes Entrance.

School communication - The school website was changed and updated regularly to reflect school activities and events.

Bushfire support and donations - The school was given quite a few bikes too and all of the children were given beautiful handmade quilts to take home. The school also received handmade bird feeders to put in the gardens to bring back the birds. We also had some new faces visit the school during Term 1. They were the Regional Director from the Department of Education. Her name was Debbie Locco who visited our school and met students and staff to check in to see how we were all coping and we had a drama teacher donate his time to come up and visit our school from Melbourne to run a drama class. Children were also given several gift bags from Save the Children The army supplied the school with bottled water and we were given a whole lot of snack packs too to munch on during this term. We also received sec-

Breakfast / lunch - Food Bank started their deliveries this year and we were given apples, cereal, milk and canned food, as well as take home boxes of food.

Despite the fact that we haven't spent the whole year at school, we have had a very productive year a lot of changes and activities that have happened both inside and outside the classrooms. I am very grateful to the positive changes these have made to the school.

2021

At the start of next year, the school will be employing a tutor to work with targeted students who require extra assistance and their timetable will be finalised next year.

We received a grant from Oz Harvest and we will be given kitchen equipment and frying pan sets for our cooking program to commence in Term 2.

New seating and tables will be delivered over the school holidays to replace the existing furniture in the junior and senior classrooms.

The junior class will have a make over and be freshened up and repainted by me.


I have applied for a grant for the Victorian Government's Living Safely with Pets Primary School Program and I am hopeful this will occur in either Terms 1 or 2 next year.
